A WORD ABOUT BEARS

While bear sightings are not uncommon at this time of the year, there has been an increase in bear incidents. As a result, we are taking precautions to ensure that our children remain safe.

Staff will scan the schoolyard for bears before and during nutrition breaks.

Students will remain indoors or return indoors if there is a bear on school property.

We remind students to not take shortcuts through the bush when walking to and from school. We also encourage students to walk together and ask that parents/guardians reinforce these messages with their

As always, we will continue to be vigilant about bear sightings near our school and will notify the Ministry of Natural Resources and Greater Sudbury Police Service, as needed.
