Inclement Weather

In the event of inclement weather, please listen to the radio for cancellation of buses and classes.

In the interest of the safety and well-being of staff and students, busses will be cancelled when weather conditions warrant such action.

To find out if schools are closed or buses are operating, please listen to the radio. Every attempt will be made to announce class cancellations on the various radio stations by 7 am.

When buses are cancelled, Rainbow District School Board staff is expected to report to work when it is safe for them to do so. In extreme conditions, there may not be anyone present to receive students upon their arrival. It's important for parents/guardians to note that students will only be admitted to school when accompanied by a teacher or other person authorized by the Principal.

So please listen to the radio in the event of inclement weather. If classes are cancelled, please do not bring your child to school.

If schools are open but buses are cancelled and you drop your child off, please remember that you must pick your child up at the end of the day. For school bus cancellations and school closures, visit rainbowschools.ca and click on Transportation under Highlights.

Tips for Packing Lunches

- Pack foods your child likes (they need to be well-fueled throughout the day) **for both nutrition breaks**

- Children prefer smaller portions and more variety
- Mix and match foods from each of the 4 food groups
- No "nuts / or may contain traces of nuts" products please
- Thank you for not sealing thermoses too tight (sometime even the adults can't open them)
- Please pack forks and spoons if necessary

- No knives please (please cut fruit at home if your child prefers it cut, scoring orange peels makes it easier for the children to peel them)

- Please do not send foods that need to be heated (students **do not** have access to a microwave)

Winter Weather

Please ensure that your child is properly dressed for outdoor play. Fresh air and active play are required during the day!

The following discretionary guidelines are followed:

15 - 20° below - We normally go out for all recesses

- 20 25° below We go out for some recesses or shortened periods depending on wind factor
- 25 30° below Indoor recesses

Rainbow Schools turn down the heat for Sweater Day on February 7

Rainbow District School Board is turning down the heat and inviting all students and staff to wear a sweater on Thursday, February 7, 2019.

"Sweater Day is intended to raise awareness about renewable energy and change behaviour around energy consumption," says Director of Education Norm Blaseg.
